

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



audi Arabia is a nation on the Arabian Peninsula in Western Asia, formally known as the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

The leisure travel market is expanding at an incredibly fast pace.

Travelers seeking an adventurous trip will find that Saudi Arabia has a lot to offer in terms of adventure, culture, and legacy.

Saudi Arabia is an extraordinarily distinctive travel destination with a wide range of activities. There is much to discover, from the pure white sands along

the Red Sea coast to the magnificent vistas on the cliffs of the Sarwat Mountains of Aseer to the ancient coastal city of Jeddah.

Saudi Arabia is home to about 10,000 archaeological sites including six UNESCO World Heritage sites, namely:

- Al-Ahsa Oasis, an Evolving Cultural Landscape (2018)- Al Ahsa is the model for a lush desert oasis because it has more than 2.5 million date palm trees. There is a lot to discover in the 6,000-year-old oasis, from hot springs to ancient mosques. The khalasah date, which locals consider to be the best in the world, must be tried.
- At-Turaif District in ad-Dir'iyah (2010): Visitors can tour Diriyah, the site of the first Saudi state, which is located outside

of Riyadh. One of our most ambitious heritage developments is located in Diriyah, which was formerly a hub for commerce and pilgrims.

- Hegra Archaeological Site (al-Hijr) (2008)- The archaeological site of Hegra, which once served as a bustling international trading center, has survived virtually unaltered for almost 2,000 years. But Saudi Arabia has now officially allowed visitors to the site for the first time. Aware visitors will remark that the rock-cut buildings at Hegra resemble those at its more wellknown sister site, Petra, in Jordan, a few hundred kilometers to the north. The Nabataean kingdom's second city was Hegra, but Hegra is much more than just Petra's underdog; it may hold the key to revealing the mysteries of a longforgotten ancient culture.
- Himā Cultural Area (2021)—There is a sizable collection of rock art images in the Bi'r'im Cultural Area that show hunting, animals, vegetation, and lifestyles during 7,000 years. Travelers and troops camped there throughout history, up to the late 20th century, leaving behind a variety of rock inscriptions and petroglyphs. The land and its buffer zone are abundant in unexcavated archaeological resources, including cairns, stone structures, interments, stone tool scatters, and an ancient well.

Musnad, South-Arabian, Thamudic, Greek, and Arabi are among the scripts used for inscription

• Historic Jeddah, the Gate to Makkah (2014)- On the Red Sea's eastern shore, the ancient city of Jeddah is located. It was created as a significant port for Indian Ocean trade routes, directing products to Mecca, in the 7th century AD. Additionally, it served as a seaport for Muslim pilgrims traveling by sea to Mecca. Due to these dual functions, the city grew to become a thriving multicultural hub with a unique architectural tradition, including tower houses constructed by the city's mercantile elites in the late 19th century that combined Red Sea coastal coral building traditions with influences and crafts from along the trade routes.



Saudi Arabia is evolving to become the center for leisure and entertainment in the area, in addition to its wealth of natural beauty. Visitors can attend MDL Beast, the largest music festival in the area, and Riyadh Season, which brings the city to life and is home to the largest lifestyle event in the world, throughout the winter. Athletes will find the fastest F1 street circuit in Jeddah. You can dive into the Red Sea's pristine coral landscapes if you're a year-round traveler.

• Rock Art in the Hail Region of Saudi Arabia (2015)—Jabal Umm Sinman at Jubbah and Jabal Al-Manjor/Jabal Raat make up the two halves of "Rock Art in the Hail Region." The biggest and richest rock art complexes in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and the rest of the region are found in these areas. The local natural backdrop and patterns of human settlement in these places were affected by desertification processes that began in the mid-Holocene. Countless petroglyph panels and a wealth of inscriptions depict the changes.


CITY OF ROSES and AL BALAD:

The Makkah region includes Taif, also referred to as the "City of Roses." Famously fragrant flowers that bloom in the wadis and mountains surrounding the city are well-known for their fragrance. Each spring, more than 300 million roses are grown on more than 900 rose farms. The crop is brought to distilleries located across the city, where it is turned into some of the most expensive rose oil, or attar, as well as rose water, which is added to highend manufacturers' perfumes. Visitors experience the pleasure of the journey to Taif as they pass deep valleys, rose fields, and fruit markets as they wind their way through the mountains. Taif is the ideal place to escape the heat as it is Saudi Arabia's unofficial summer capital.

The Historical Jeddah-Al Balad, often known as "Historical Jeddah," is a UNESCO World Heritage Site that was constructed on lovely coastline terrain and features exquisite original architecture. Both history and culture enthusiasts will be fascinated by the ancient residences, structures, and museums. Admire dozens of historic Hijazi homes that have been transformed into







restaurants or museums, showcasing the distinctive fusion of old and new Jeddah and bringing to life the history and culture of Saudi Arabia.

Rijal Almaa's hometown, the hilly Aseer region in the south, was chosen as a UNWTO "Best Tourism Village" in 2021. Rijal Almaa is a more than 700-year-old city with castles and vibrant buildings. Basalt rocks were used to construct its massive stone buildings, giving them the strength and endurance to withstand the test of time. The exterior walls are heavily adorned with white quartz stone, while the interior is decorated with exquisite artwork.

SAUDI ARABIA AS A SHOPPER'S PARADISE

Locals enjoy going shopping in Saudi Arabia because Saudis enjoy it and because department shops and shopping centers offer the best (and coldest) air conditioning. How can I choose something that will last?



Another one is Oal'at al-Bahrain, also known as Bahrain Fort, which is the island's oldest still-standing structure. It is a sandcolored fortification. It is a tiny fragment of mediaeval history in a rapidly modernizing country.The Muharraq pearling trail, which is a testament to the centuries-old practice of harvesting pearls, comes in third. 330,000 square metres of this road are taken up by oyster beds and structures associated to the 19th-century pearl industry. The homes along the trail were owned by prosperous businessmen in that time period. To tell the narrative of pearling to tourists, many of these have since been repaired and transformed into museums, libraries, auditoriums, etc.

Bahrain as a destination is a melting pot of cultures and religions which co-



exist peacefully with each other for many years now. The destination is home to 19 churches, a Jewish synagogue and a 200 year old Hindu temple.

Set against a beautiful seascape, the Al Fateh Grand Mosque presents a striking picture with its architecture reflecting Middle Eastern elements. With a 6,500 square metre floor area, this architectural masterpiece can hold nearly 7,000 worshipers at once. It took over four years to construct this marvel, with resources from all over the world. When you enter the mosque, you will see its superb architecture, with a striking huge dome. It is the largest dome in the world and is built entirely of fiberglass. The interiors of this place will take your breath away. The floors are made from Italian marble, the striking chandelier is from Austria, the teak wood is from India, the lamps around the mosque are from France, and the carpet is from Ireland. It has become an iconic tourist attraction. It is also the site of Bahrain's National Library, which houses over 50,000 volumes of books in English and Arabic.

Apart from the Bahrain Fort, Bahrain is home to many gorgeous forts, but you shouldn't miss visiting the Arad Fort, which was built in the 15th century in the



classic Arabic style. It is among the Middle East's most significant fortified castles. The stronghold is magnificent during the day with its sand-colored walls and huge turrets, but at night, when spot lights are used to illuminate the walls, it truly comes to life. After you visit the fort, you can take a stroll along the waterfront, the view is just mesmerizing at sunset. Jarada Island, which is located 40 minutes from Bahrain's main land is another mystical wonder. It is a small, magical beach of sand that is only visible







Cyprus




Namibia
