How does Jamaica plan to address any



potential barriers such as visa procedures or connectivity issues that may hinder Indian tourists from visiting the destination?

Destination Jamaica offers visa on arrival for the Indian travellers for up to 30 days. Travellers coming to Jamaica are mandated to fill out the immigration form online. The Immigration/Customs (C5) Form is an entry requirement for persons travelling to the island, whether they are residents in famous Bob Marley Museum, the former Jamaica or visiting.

Jamaica is a long-haul destination for Indians, there is no direct connectivity. However, Destination Jamaica is well connected from various parts of the world and has an easy access from the US, Canada, London, Frankfurt, Paris, Amsterdam and we are also in discussions with some gulf carriers.

Please let us know about top 5 things to do/destinations in Jamaica. Indian Travellers are always on the lookout for a new, exotic and experiential holiday vacation and Jamaica fits the bill

Stretching 16 km long and plunging 800m deep, its majestic grandeur and exquisite symmetry make it one of the world's most captivating locations, leaving an indelible impression on all who visit. For a different kind of adventure, saddle up for a horseback ride in Stilbaai, located in the Western Cape. Explore the enchanting coastline and delve into the area's rich cultural heritage, immersing yourself in its coastal charm and scenic vistas. McGregor, also situated in the Western Cape, holds a unique allure with its artistic

ambiance. Retaining much of its 19th-century architectural charm, McGregor is adorned with quaint, white-washed cottages and sprawling gardens, exuding an irresistible old-world charm and artistic flair. No trip to South Africa would be complete without indulging in a round of wine tasting, and the Stellenbosch region stands out as the ultimate destination for oenophiles. Home to some of the most renowned wineries, Stellenbosch promises an unforgettable sensory journey through its exquisite wines and picturesque vineyards. To anyone visiting South Africa, I would recommend them to sample some of my personal favourite, Chakalaka with Dombolo; A hearty flavourful dish with a side of light and fresh steamed bread.

Going forward, please share your vision for the coming 5 years. As the travel and tourism industry increasingly embraces digital platforms, we are strategically directing our efforts toward



engaging consumers where they spend the bulk of their time: online. Over more than two decades of presence in India, we have cultivated a strong digital footprint and strengthened our partnerships with Indian trade, particularly in Tier 1 cities. This is evidenced by the steady inbound traffic from India. In recent years, our strategic focus has shifted towards broadening our reach into Tier 2 and Tier 3 cities across India. We firmly believe that this expansion will fuel the next phase of growth for South African Tourism within the country. To make the Rainbow Nation more accessible and affordable to Indian travelers, we are actively pursuing partnerships with airlines to introduce value-driven deals and offers tailored to benefit travelers from India. LIMA. PERU

Rising over a long shoreline of crumbling cliffs, this Enormous metropolis is the second-driest capital in the world after Cairo. The city spans high-rise condos Constructed next to ancient temples. The best views of the city are seen from atop the cliffs surrounding it. It is fascinating that Lima is also a long-standing Civilization. Elegant museums feature exquisite pottery, galleries present cutting-edge artwork; solemn religious processions harken back to the 18th century, and packed nightclubs

are the perfect places for anyone who FOOD; CITY THRILLS; A TICKET TO THE likes to have a good time. A gastronomic revolution that has been in development for SIDE UP! A TRUTHFUL REPRESENTATION more than 400 years in the Capital's cuisine is something that no visitor can miss.

> That's Lima. Messy, full of artistic delights, and Shrouded in history (and occasionally fog).

UMBRIA. ITALY

Umbria, the lush heart of Italy, is the only area in the Country without a maritime or international border. Due to its geographic isolation, Italy has been able to maintain many of its ancient traditions. Here, you can still find grandparents in aprons preparing pasta by hand and front doors that haven't been locked in centuries.

Most famous are the medieval hilltop

towns, many of which are stunningly maintained and situated. The massive Gothic cathedral in Orvieto and the fresco-covered basilica in Assisi both bear the imprints of the Etruscans, Romans, quarreling medieval families, and Renaissance painters.

The rugged beauty of the Monti Sibillini is contrasted with the smooth rise and fall of verdant slopes and meadows dotted with wildflowers. With restaurants offering black truffles, exquisite cured meats, and robust local wines, foodies will feel right at home here.

FUKUOKA, JAPAN

Kysh's major city and Japan's eighth-largest population center is the sunny, welcoming Fukuoka

It is made up of two former towns: the



merchant town of Hakata on the east bank and the castle town of Fukuoka on the west bank of the Nakagawa. Although the two towns were combined to form Fukuoka in 1889, the term Hakata is still frequently used

and has cultural Significance (for example, Fukuoka Airport is Hakata Station). Hakata has a 2000-year-long commercial

history. The city is well-known among Japanese people for its hearty Hakata



ramen and Softbank Hawks's baseball team.

Fukuoka's warm climate and modern attractions-including art, architecture, shopping, and cuisine—make it an excellent starting point for trips throughout the region. It also makes a fantastic gateway to Kyrgyzstan.

CITY THRILLS

BERGEN, NORWAY

Bergen in Norway, with its breathtaking position in the heart of majestic mountains, is also known as the Capital of the Fjords. Once you visit, you will understand why. Bright wooden cottages line the dock here, and the entire town is a sight to behold.

SEOUL, SOUTH KOREA

The city's cultural sector is thriving as a result of recent openings including the Konig Gallery and the Seoul Museum of Art.

In the meantime, several new hotels have opened in the area, including the surprisingly hip Fairmont Ambassador Seoul and the Josun Palace, a Luxury



Collection Hotel, in Seoul Gangnam, that offers expansive views of the famed neighborhood and gorgeous public areas, such as the 1914 Lounge & Bar.

MADRID, SPAIN

Fortunately, it appears that the capital of Spain is slowly shedding its reputation as the nation's somewhat stuffy commercial center. A surge of upscale hotel

openings across the city has aided in the transformation of what was once a staid environment.

CULTURAL PAST CAIRO AND THE NILE

The Grand Egyptian Museum, which is located close to the Great Pyramids of Giza, may finally open this spring after more than

a decade of construction.

What can you expect? More than a million square feet of display space, treasures including a 40-foot-tall monument of Ramses II, outdoor gardens, and a sizable plaza from which visitors may view the surrounding desert. Meanwhile, several brand-new, opulent ships have begun cruising the Nile: The Viking Osiris, an allveranda ship with 82 passengers, and the lavish Sphinx which has 42 cabins covered in marble and hand-carved wood, are two of the best options.

ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA

Alexandria is a city that you will fall in love with because of its picture-perfect cobblestone streets and easy accessibility to the wineries of northern Virginia. As cities across the American South struggle with the Confederacy's legacy, the way the city is dealing with its past is fascinating to observe. Alexandria was established in 1749 as a port for tobacco. The largest domestic slave trade in the nation took place for several decades of the 19th century in the city. Three brand-new exhibitions honoring those who were forcibly taken here are now available at the Freedom House Museum.

Moreover, the 2020-launched African American Heritage Trail covers nearly



200 years of history at 11 stations along the Potomac River, including the Torpedo Factory, where many Black Americans labored during World War II. 20 new stops will be added to the route in February 2023, including Waterfront Park, the harbor from

where slaves were transported to cities like New Orleans.

Visitors can discover more about Benjamin Banneker, a Maryland-born inventor, mathematician, and free African American.





MACHU PICHU

Kaohsiung in Taiwan – A well-preserved secret of the Far East

traddled diagonally between China and Japan is the island country of Taiwan, and sitting at the Southwestern edge of Taiwan by the shores of the Taiwan Straits is the city of Kaohsiung (the second largest city in Taiwan). The influence of these two powerful countries Japan and China has been believed to play a major part in the development of the port city of Kaohsiung. From a mere fishing hamlet in the olden days, the city of Kaohsiung has seen many ups and downs on its turbulent journey to becoming the business, industrial, and trading powerhouse of Taiwan as well as its busiest port. Having been under Japanese rule for some 50 (1895-1945)



years, the city was the point of contact for Taiwan to the outside world and vice versa under rule as it was the Japanese garrison city. Fortunately, the city of Kaohsiung didn't have to bear the brunt of war outbreaks to a great extent despite being a strategic military base, because the consequences of war are incalculable, and damage to Kaohsiung could mean suffering (economic and social) in all of Taiwan. Having grown steadily from there, it comes as no surprise that today Kaohsiung is the largest municipality in Taiwan and its most important port.

But there's much more to Kaohsiung than just the industrial and trading facets. Having undergone colonization under the Dutch, the Japanese, and the Chinese, Kaohsiung's culture and tradition are fairly versatile, and traces of each influence can be felt around the city.

Located at a distance of 360 kilometres from Taipei (the capital of Taiwan), it can be reached by HSR (High-Speed Rail) in 2 hours from there, while the distance from



Tai Chung is roughly 200 km which can be covered in a little over an hour.

Love River is more or less the focal point of Kaohsiung which runs through the core of the city and is a great place to catch your breath. A walk by the river will slow down time as you watch ferries and gondolas pass back and forth. Walking under the tree



shades on either side can be very soothing to the eye as you admire the glistening and shiny water that flows by. This river was barely a stream in its primate times, but the locals have worked hard to revive it to what it is today and that is a true testimony of the hard-working origins of the people of Kaohsiung. It is probably named Love



the lakeside, it has a lot of photogenic spots that are Instagram-worthy.

The most interesting and coolest attraction at Lotus Lake is the Dragon and Tiger Pagodas. A zig-zagging pathway from No.9 Liantan Road directs you to the Dragon and Tiger Pagodas. These twin pagodas have a dragon and a tiger at their entrance and popular belief has it that to get rid of bad luck and get good luck in your life one must enter through the dragon's mouth and exit from the tiger's mouth. Be sure to climb the seven-story pagodas and enjoy the views from the top while also admiring the art on the walls within the pagodas. There





River as a lot of couples on a date frequent this place, it was earlier called Kaohsiung Canal and by other oriental names in olden days. A big statue of 'Ao', a mythological half-dragon – half-fish figure makes a good selfie spot by the Love River. The best time to visit is in the evening when the bridge over the river is lit up and the promenade running parallel to the river comes alive with bustling pretty cafes and open-air restaurants. During a certain Dragon Boat Festival, boat races are held in the Love

River while during the lantern festival, the riversides are decorated with lit-up lanterns.

Probably the most popular area of Kaohsiung is Lotus Lake. This is one of the largest lakes (being 1500 meters long and 500 meters wide) in Taiwan and is a manmade lake. It is one of the most popular attractions where locals and tourists can be seen hanging around throughout the day and the evening. With a variety of colourful pagodas, temples, pavilions, and statues at

is a depiction of the 18 levels of hell in Taiwanese mythology and it is displayed in a manner to discourage people from committing sins.

Right opposite the Dragon and Tiger Pagodas is a beautiful temple built in honour of Baosheng Dadi (God of Medicine).

A very prominent structure at Lotus Pond is the 72-meter-high statue of the mysterious warrior Xuan Wu (believed to be the ruler of the North Pole in the local mythology). Visitors can even walk into the statue through an entrance at the base and climb up several floors inside the towering statue which houses shrines at each level.

The spring and Autumn Pavilions overtly showcase traditional architecture. On the outside, the Pavilion is a visual treat with the backdrop of the lake, and you can enter the dragon mouth which has steps leading in and is shaped like an inclining tunnel within. On either side of the tunnel, you will see colourful murals depicting their mythology, tradition, and culture.

Being at Lotus Lake makes one feel carefree. The best way to explore the area is on foot. By the road that runs parallel to the Lotus Lake are many food stalls serving a variety of snacks and fresh-cut fruit to take care of hunger calls and guench your thirst. It is a great place to watch the sun go down towards the end of the day and one should not miss out on capturing the beautiful sunsets here. Enchanting views take shape across Kaohsiung when the sun sets and the city lights up.

Chi Jin Island at Kaohsiung is a well-known fishing powerhouse. The place has been intensely involved with fishing probably ever since the time of its habitation. This island can be easily reached by short ferry rides from the ferry jetty at Shiziwan. It is barely a 10-minute ride. Lots of fishing families have been here generation after generation. You could rent a bicycle to get around this island. Among the most popular places to visit is Thean Hou Temple on Chi Jin Island, which is dedicated to the Goddess Martu – The protector of sailors. Monkey Mountain is a great hike where you can see cohorts of playful monkeys among other flora and fauna. The seafood at Ya Jiao restaurant is guite popular on Chi Jin Island and most tourists prefer having lunch over here. A seafood platter with cold beer checks the box for me on a hot tiring day. And I'm quite sure it's the same for most enthusiastic travelers. The lighthouse at Chi Jin Island (built by the British) offers great panoramic views of the city, the sea, and the far-off horizon. This lighthouse has a great collection of old photographs on display from the time the lighthouse was newly built.

85 Sky Tower is the most prominent landmark in Kaohsiung. One cannot miss this building especially while taking the ferry to Chi Jin Island or when getting back from there. At the top of the 85 Sky Tower is a viewing deck for tourists to soak in authoritative views of the city. The building has as many as 92 elevators. One of these elevators can reach the 77th floor in just 45 seconds making it the 3rd fastest lift in the world. This imposing structure can be prominently sighted from various parts of the city and is the most iconic landmark of Kaohsiung among foreign tourists. One can notice the co-existence of modern concrete and glass buildings with traditional oriental architecture in Kaohsiung. The city can be seen mingling the old with the new in various areas. Taiwan's largest Confucius temple is also in Kaohsiung.

The art on the ceiling at Kaohsiung Formosa station is worth looking at from various angles. Even if one is passing by this station on his journey, he should step off at Kaohsiung station and get a look at it before resuming his journey. Designed by the renowned artist Narcissus Quagliata, this art on the ceiling showcases a theme





station (established by the Japanese) and the important role it played in the city's industrialization and civil modernization aspects. This is a fine place to visit for an entire family. Interesting historical facts to know as well as fun for the kids to hop onto the old rail bogies. At the rear of the museum is a sizeable park where one could relax and families could picnic. A miniature train runs around the park which is fun. It could make you feel like a child all over again. Once a week (generally on a weekend) a flea market is put up with local artistry on sale. This is a place to find a perfect souvenir for collectors.

Tucked away from the skyscrapers, the industrial and commercial zone of the



city is the peaceful sanctum, Fo Guang Shan Monastery. This is the largest monastery in all of Taiwan. Upon entering you will be led across a huge pathway with eight pagodas lined up on either side facing each other. The main shrine is embellished with a big and beautiful golden Buddha statue (36 meters high) sitting on top. The order of this monastery encourages the practice of Humanistic Buddhism. Fo Guang Shan means Buddha's Light Mountain and this place enshrines the spirits of Buddhist teachings, philosophy, and lifestyle in a majestic atmosphere. There are enough attractions within the premises for droolworthy sights and for enlightening oneself on a spiritual plane. For those who are not Buddhists, a trip to this monastery proves to be very insightful as you learn a lot about various aspects of Buddhism, and those who are Buddhists or are aware of Buddhism will sharpen their knowledge and be grateful to have visited this monastery. The highlight is the Jade Buddha and Gold Buddha displayed at the main Pagoda. Photography inside is prohibited, but one look at these magnificent statues will remain like a photographic memory in your mind. Lots of master craftsmanship can be noticed in the statues (stone as well as wooden) erected in various parts of the monastery. This is like a big palatial museum where Buddha's tooth relics are also kept. Even after leaving from the monastery, one can feel its warmth and aura for a long time. One must visit this monastery when exploring Kaohsiung and preferably keep it for the last part of his / her trip.

Something not to be missed in Taiwan is 'Pearl Milk Tea' or 'Bubble Tea'. Pearl milk tea was invented in the late 80's right here in Taiwan (in the neighbouring city of Taichung which is only an hour's journey from Kaohsiung by the bullet train from the High-Speed Rail Station). This marvellous beverage was invented as a result of a simple experiment by a local restaurateur using tapioca pearl and regular tea. The result was astonishingly great, so much so that the business of this refreshing beverage has grown by cosmic scales and turned into a multi-milliondollar global industry in recent times. A very refreshing beverage especially when served cold with ice and the best place to have it is at 'The Original Store of Chun Sui Tang', that's where the idea of bubble



tea came up with subsequent successful experimenting. Today probably a hundred (or even more) varieties of bubble tea are served across restaurants and stores in in Taiwan.

is a great diving location 100 km (90 Minutes' drive) south of Kaohsiung. It's the southernmost tip of Taiwan. One can visit this place to satisfy his thrill-seeking side. This place has a beautiful beach and various activities such as diving and surfing. ATVs are available here for riding around the area. The place is particularly great for a morning excursion and has a very peaceful

environment in general.

In my opinion, the city of Kaohsiung is a very underrated tourist destination, but that's probably a blessing in disguise Taiwan. This beverage is an absolute must because one of the best things about this place is that a tourist rush hasn't mobbed this If one is a bit of a thrill seeker, then Kenting place like some of the popular destinations in the South East and the Far East, and one can patiently go through the various moods of the city with time on his side. It's quite incredible when you think of how much variety a small place can offer to its visitors. If one is willing to indulge in fancy foodstuff, inexpensive transportation (though more expensive than some of the South East Asian destinations which are dirt cheap) with hills, rivers, seaside,

beaches, fast-paced city streets with laidback zones too, and enchanting monasteries, one must visit Taiwan. And once in Taiwan, Kaohsiung is a recommended destination. I strongly feel the tourism aspects of Kaohsiung will only get better and better, and that the best part of Kaohsiung's story is still being written.
